Adverbs

An adverb is a word that describes a verb.

An adverb tells **how**, **when**, or **where** the verb happens.

Many adverbs that tell how end with the letters ly.

example: Joan painted <u>slowly</u>. Slowly describes the action painted.

When you compare two actions, the adverb will often end with the letters *er* or est.

example: Birds fly <u>higher</u> than insects. *Higher* describes the verb fly. Airplanes fly <u>highest</u> of all. *Highest* describes the action fly.
